
■ Period of Study

The programme usually takes six semesters (3 years) to complete. In this time, you need to write your doctoral thesis and complete all required instructional classes from the subject catalogue. The Dean of Studies responsible can grant permission for a shorter period of study.

Guide to the **Doctoral Programme** at Graz University of Technology's Doctoral School of Architecture This guide is based on the documents "Curriculum for the Doctoral Programme in Technical Sciences"

and "Regulations Doctoral School Architecture", 2020

This guide is aimed at PhD researchers at the Doctoral School for Architecture at Graz University of Technology.

Admission

If you want to start a PhD in the field of architecture, you need to hold a relevant technical or natural sciences master's degree (or equivalent) from a university or another recognised post-secondary educational institution.

For admission you need to have a topic for your doctoral thesis and a supervisor who has provided you with a supervision confirmation. Admission to the doctoral programme takes place at the Registrar's Office (Rechbauerstrasse 12/1st floor | studienservice@tugraz.at | Tel.: +43 (316) 873 6149).

■ Supervision and Mentoring

After being admitted to the doctoral programme, you conclude an educational agreement with your supervisor. After your supervisor has assumed their role, the forms must be submitted electronically via TUGRAZonline. In addition to your supervisor you can also consult a mentor during the doctoral programme for advice and support.

- Instructional classes from the master's curriculum for architecture can be chosen instead of the recommended subject-specific basic courses.
- Up to 2 semester hours' worth of *soft-skill courses* (presentation skills, rhetoric, etc.) can be selected from catalogues from different degree programmes.

The language of instruction in all classes is English. Please decide which courses you will take at the beginning of your degree and enter your selection into the form "Instructional Classes" Hand this form in at the Dean's Office

■ Doctoral Thesis

You are required to write a doctoral thesis as part of the doctoral programme. It proves your ability to master new scientific problems independently. The thesis is to be bound and designed in compliance with the directives of Graz University of Technology and should have a formal structure.

You can find more detailed information on writing your doctoral thesis in the mandatory citation guidelines provided by Graz University of Technology. If writing your doctoral thesis in English it is recommended to follow the Chicago Manual of Style.

■ Assessment and Doctoral Examination (Defensio)

Both the doctoral candidate and supervisor can suggest reviewers. Please bear in mind that it is not permitted for all selected reviewers to work at the same institute

The doctoral examination is the final exam in the doctoral programme. The candidate starts by giving a presentation on his or her PhD thesis lasting around 30 minutes. Afterwards, the candidate responds to questions from the thesis committee and "defends" his/her thesis against any point of criticism (ca. 20 min. per examiner). You can register for the doctoral examination at the Dean's Office.
