

Werner Hauser studied law at the University of Graz and works as professor for public and private economic law as well as head of the section "law" at the University of Applied Sciences FH JOANNEUM in Graz. For many years he lectured at the Institute of Science, Technology and Society Studies at Alpen Adria Universität Klagenfurt. Since 2018 he gives lectures on various aspects of "Technologies and Law" at STS - Science, Technology and Society Unit/TU Graz.

Before that he acted as assistant at the institute for economic law in Graz, as a trainee at the "OLG" Graz, as head of the legal department at Joanneum Research, worked for the administration at the Government of Styria, acted as chief executive of the "Steirischen Wissenschafts-, Umwelt- und Kulturprojektträger GmbH" and furthermore as head of the "Ludwig Boltzmann-Forschungsstelle für Bildungs- und Wissenschaftsrecht" amongst others. Apart from his papers and researches in the field of the organization and law of companies and the field of health care, he primarily deals with questions concerning the system of higher education, the educational system and (scientific) research (organization, funding, politics). He teaches at several universities. Moreover, he is a management consultant and a member of various

supervisory boards (the supervisory board of the Joanneum Research Forschungsgesellschaft mbH inter alia).

He founded several pertinent series of books (e. g. "Schriften zum Bildungsrecht und zur Bildungspolitik"/Verlag Österreich) and is the editor of – inter alia – the "Neuen@Hochschul-Zeitung (N@HZ)" (Neuer Wissenschaftlicher Verlag).
