

Christian Dayé studied sociology and philosophy at the University of Graz (Mag. phil. 2004, Dr. phil. 2012). From 2015 to 2018, he was assistant professor (non-tenure track) at the Department of Sociology at University of Klagenfurt. He joined the STS Unit of TU Graz in 2018 and has worked on various projects relating to the sociology of science, knowledge, and technology, science and technology studies, futures studies, and technology assessment. Since 2023, he has been heading the inter-university research platform Zukunft – Technik – Gesellschaft (<https://futures-studies.tugraz.at>), a cooperation between TU Graz and the University of Graz. Over the years, he has taught at seven universities in Austria, Germany, as well as Croatia. In 2025, he received his habilitation from the University of Graz with a *venia legendi* in sociology.

Christian has published widely in international outlets, among them *Social Studies of Science*, *History of Human Science*, and *Science and Public Policy*. He is the author of two monographs, [\*Experts, Social Scientists, and Techniques of Prognosis in Cold War America\*](#) (Palgrave Macmillan 2020; recipient of the 2022 Distinguished Scholarly Publication Award of the History of Sociology & Social Thought Section of the American Sociological Association) and most recently [\*Futures Thinking: Epistemic Tribes and Territories\*](#) (Palgrave Macmillan 2025). He is currently a member of the board of [STS Austria](#) and serves on the editorial boards of several international journals, including [Tecnoscienza](#), [Society](#), [The American Sociologist](#), and the [Journal of the History of the Behavioral Sciences](#).
