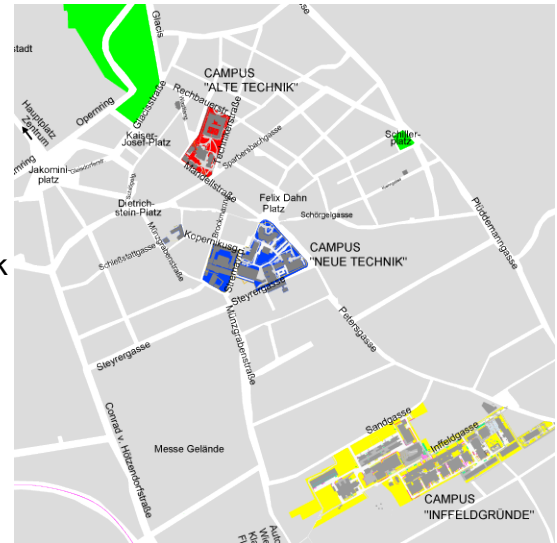

■ Initial situation in 2006

- No parking space management
- 1,343 people had space to park
- No clear rules regarding who was allowed to use parking space
- Topic was controversial
- Fees submitted to finance (private use in "blue zone")
- Clear desire expressed for the administration to manage the parking areas

- Management of parking space
- Expansion of cycling infrastructure
- Encouragement to use public transport
- E-car sharing
- Creation of communication zones in the public space

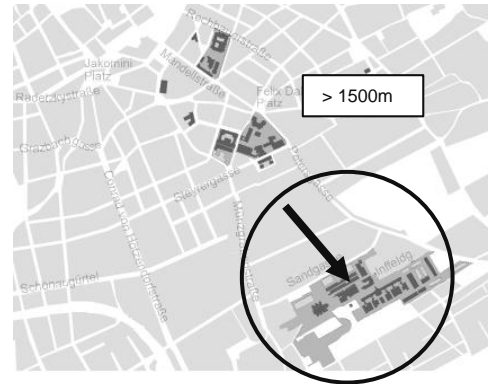


■ Taking action

- Managing parking space: Inffeldgasse as an example

Basic rule: People whose residence is > 2500 m as the crow flies from the workplace (AT and NT campuses) can park here.

INFF > 1500 m as the crow flies.



■ Encouraging the use of public transport

- People who waive their right to park can receive a reimbursement for approx. 50% of the cost of an annual or half-year ticket (zone 1).
- The reimbursement takes place via the Graz Linien in the form of vouchers



■ Expanding the cycling infrastructure

- Installation of covered parking spaces for bicycles
- Installation of self-service bike stations
- Organisation of annual bicycle service day
- Many people made happy by offers of personal TU bicycles + workshops



■ Creation of communication zones in public space

- Seating possibilities
- Availability of drinking water
- Wireless internet access



■ Results up until 05 2022

- Parking permits reduced from 1343 to 740
(minimal distance has been increased to 3 km as the crow flies)
- 1,360 additional covered bike parking spaces created
- 450 staff members take advantage of our annual bike service day on campus
- More than 2,000 bicycles with the TU Graz design can be seen riding through the city
- The purchase of an e-bike, a cargo bike, or a folding bike is subsidised by €150.
- 650 employees take advantage of the annual voucher campaign to buy a public transport ticket
(the subsidy is now €150 per ticket)
- 6 e-cars for car sharing have been installed on the TU premises along with charging stations
- 7 outdoor communication zones have been created to encourage interaction and relaxation
